- Facility improvements (Community Design Team)






Our Revenue Sources

 - Capital projects (technology)
- Non-Voter Approved Levies
 - Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) obligations

 - Long Term Facility Maintenance








Understanding Enrollment Needs





ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS

- First five projection years (2019-20 to 2024-25)
 - K-5 increases 55 to 180 students
 - 6-8 increases 89 to 149 students
 - 9-12 increases 112 to 123 students
- In ten years (2019-20 to 2029-30)
 - K-5 increases 43 to 190 students
 - 6-8 increases by 108 to 222 students
 - 9-12 increases by 323 to 388 students

10 year projection = 8,881 to 9,153 students

Increase of 501 to 773 students from 2019-2020 enrollment of 8,380

Enrollment Survey Results

Of the approximately 2,300 students who chose 100% Online Learning:

- About 66% are likely to return to our schools post-pandemic
- 40% are interested in online learning post-pandemic

Of the approximately 650 students who left our district for other options this year:

- 60% indicated Hybrid Learning was a major factor in their decision
- About 50% are likely to return to our schools post-pandemic
