



### PREVENTION: Creating Safe, Welcoming Schools


### Focus on prevention:

# **EVACUATE**"To A Safe Location"

#### **Students will:**

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

#### **Staff will:**

- Bring attendance and "Go Bag"
- Lead students to evacuation site
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems

#### When Might We EVACUATE?

Fire or other hazardous situation that makes it unsafe to remain in school



### **SHELTER**

### Students and staff will:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground
- Staff will account for students and adults



### When Might We SHELTER?

Tornado, flood or other disaster situation

# **SECURE** "Get Inside. Lock Doors."

### **Students will:**

- Return to inside of the building
- Do business as usual

### **Staff will:**

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults


### When Might We SECURE?

Situation occurring outside the school building/in the neighborhood



### **HOLD** "In Your Classroom"

Formerly called "Modified Lockdown"



#### **Students will:**

- Clear the hallways and remain in their area or classroom until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

#### **Staff will:**

- Close and lock doors
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

### When Might We HOLD?

Medical emergencies or other times when there is a need to limit traffic in hallways

# LOCKDOWN "Out of Sight"

#### Students will:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open classroom door

#### **Staff will:**

- Recover students from hallway
- Lock classroom doors
- Turn out lights and move out of sight
- Maintain silence
- Prepare to evade or defend

#### When Might We LOCKDOWN?

Active threat inside or very close to the building



### RESPONSE: Roles & Expectations

### Staff/Administration

- Care for students and keep them safe
- Follow instructions of building admin/local emergency responders
- School admin will communicate accurate information with families in a timely manner

#### **Students**

- Follow instructions of school staff
- Report relevant information to staff
- Use caution when viewing or posting to social media
- Communicate accurate information

### Parents/Families

- Remain calm
- Trust school staff and emergency responders will keep students safe
- Wait for official message from school
- Use caution when viewing or posting to social media
- Remain where you are, do not come to school
